To live wisely in trials, believers must remember truths of Scripture.

In verses 2-12, James told us that in trials we must remember:

- 1. that God providentially uses trials to strengthen our faith,
- 2. that God has the wisdom we're lacking,
- 3. to celebrate our eternal position in Christ, and
- **4.** that God's future reward to those who endure trials is a sure promise.
- 5. In trials we must remember that God doesn't tempt us, we're responsible for our sin. (vv.13-15)

4.	God never changes. (v.17b) Why is this good news? Consider this attribute of God more by reading and discussing these passages: Num. 23:19; 1 Sam. 15:29; Ps. 102:26; Mal. 3:6; Heb. 6:17–18
5.	What is the "word of truth?" If we are brought forth "by the word of truth", do you think it's possible for a person to be saved apart from the gospel?
